Mr. Ziad Musallam, Sanitary Engineer, was present for the discussion. He stated that this notice is regarding the application filed to renew the discharge permit for the Pettisville Sewer District. The Ohio EPA requires public notice of filing.</li> <li>2. It was reported that some areas were damp, but no visible outbreaks were observed. The area where the broken PVC pipe was has been removed and appeared dry. The permanent force main connection to the lift station has been completed.</li> <li>3. The Board was provided with a copy of a letter sent by the Sanitary Engineer to the Ohio EPA requesting an extension for the improvement to the Pleasant View Sewers due to lack of funding to complete the improvements as specified in NPDES permit. The letter also requested to renew the facility's NPDES permit based on the proposed extension schedule. Mr. Musallam noted that the letter stamped in had some incorrect dates on it and presented the Board with a corrected copy for their review.</li> <li>4. <a href="#">10:00:49 AM</a>	<b>Public Hearing- Reappointment of Tax Map Draftsperson</b>	<p>Commissioner Genter joined the meeting.</p> <p>Commissioner Genter opened the hearing and outlined the events of this issue. Frank Onweller, County Engineer, had previously sent a letter to the Board advising of the retirement of his employee Jack Brooks, Tax Map Draftsperson. He further requested that the Board approve the rehiring of Mr. Brooks to the same position by initiating the process of re-employing a retirant, which by ORC requires a hearing to be held for this particular position.</p> <p>Commissioner Genter turned the hearing over to Mr. Onweller. Mr. Onweller stated that he is aware that the retire/rehire process has both supporters and opponents. He is not in support of it in all cases, however feels that each position or situation should be evaluated independently. He explained that Mr. Jack Brooks was hired on February 14, 1977. The law adopted in 1953 states that the county engineer shall appoint this position, subject to the approval of the Board of Commissioners. This is the only position within the engineer's office that requires approval by the Board. Mr. Onweller referenced his letter to the Board dated August 13<sup>th</sup> wherein it is stated that Mr. Brooks continues to be productive and efficient in his work performance. He further stated that he takes great pride in his work and still has the fire and energy to perform his job duties. The benefit to rehiring Mr. Brooks to this position is that the level of service will continue, and will come at a lesser cost. Commissioner Genter inquired of Mr. Brooks wages now. Mr. Onweller stated that his wages now are at \$18.75/hour and would be hired back at a lesser rate of \$15.00/hour, resulting in \$8,600 in savings per year. In addition to that savings, Mr. Brooks currently accrues 5 weeks of vacation per year. If</p>

rehired, this accrual rate will be brought down to 2 weeks per year. Commissioner Genter stated that if a new employee was hired, there would still be the same amount of savings per year. Mr. Onweller stated that would be true, however the level of service goes down, and further, the pay of the new hire is subject to opinion also. Mr. Onweller stated that he is aware of the current economic conditions and unemployment rate. This position requires a combination of specialized training, work experience and an understanding of the surveying industry.

In conclusion, Mr. Onweller stated that he was elected by the people to operate the Engineer's Office in an efficient and fiscally responsible manner. He believes that rehiring Mr. Brooks is in the best interest of the County and is respectfully requesting the Board to authorize the rehiring of Mr. Brooks.

Commissioner Genter performed a swearing in and opened the floor for all those wishing to give testimony.

Darrell Garmenn stated that he is against the rehire. He doesn't like "double-dipping" when there is a 10% unemployment rate. In 1977 when Mr. Brooks was hired, he didn't have the skills and had to learn all those special things. Someone new could do the same thing. By rehiring Mr. Brooks, they are doing nothing for the unemployed people of the county.

Commissioner Genter asked for further testimony. None was given. The hearing was closed for testimony at 10:09:33 a.m.

The Board began deliberations:

Commissioner Barnaby stated the facts of the matter up to this point:

On August 23, 2010 the hearing was advertised in the paper and has been continuously on the website, so the requirements of the law have been met. By law, the Engineer makes the appointment and has made the recommendation. Mr. Brooks is retiring and has requested that he be rehired. The law requires the Board of Commissioners to approve this appointment. The law requires a public meeting, a requirement that has been met here today. Mr. Onweller has gone through the correct procedures to reduce costs by lowering the hourly rate and vacation time. In this day and age when resources are going down and the same projects are coming before the county to be completed, Mr. Brooks can be helpful in continuing the level of service to the county and in schooling the next person that will come in.

Commissioner Genter stated that he has made it well known before today where he stands on this issue. There have recently been some good articles in the paper on the current dilemma of the public retirement system. They too are in trouble as far as funding goes. This will be an increase in the contribution by the County and PERS which are more tax dollars that will be spent. There are more challenges ahead from our legislators. The law has been followed in this

matter by the Engineer but in these economic times he believes that he should afford others to apply for the position. If the position is advertised, applications are taken, and Mr. Brooks is still determined to be the best candidate then he would support the rehire. Government employees have the opportunity to retire at age 55 while everyone else does not have that option. They have to wait 10 year longer. He also questioned if there was any guarantee that this employee's lower pay would stay at that level and for how long. He stated that he is opposed to retiring on a Friday and receiving a payout of sick leave and vacation time and then coming back to work on a Monday to start the process over again. He stated that the money that goes to PERS goes into an annuity and will be paid out when he retires again. It does not go into the big pot like regular employees.

Commissioner Barnaby disagreed stating that a retire/rehire does not have Fulton County money coming back to him. He will only receive the PERS that he pays in personally. Commissioner Genter stated that this is something that legislators need to work on, however, they as Commissioners are not here to legislate on this, they have to follow the rules that are already in place.

Commissioner Short stated that he had heard both sides of this argument from various people since the start of this process. He noted that some either forget or are not aware of the nuances of the public and private sectors. In the private sector, a retiree receives a retirement benefit and Social Security, 2 retirement benefits. The public sector gets PERS only and only in the amount that it has been paid into. There are no social security benefits for those in the public sector. He stated that he agrees with Mr. Onweller in that each situation needs to stand on it's own. Mr. Onweller has been elected by the people to run his office as he sees fit. The 1953 ordinance is outdated but still stands on the books and it must be followed. There are so many unusual and outdated ordinances that must be followed and at times limits the ability of the elected officials to run their office as they see fit. Mr. Brooks is a 33 year employee that Mr. Onweller has spoken very highly of. With Mr. Brooks, you know what you are getting and this will promote continuity in the Engineer's Office. The pay rate reduction is a cost savings. In addition to the hard dollar wage savings of \$8,600.00, there is a soft dollars savings of \$2,100.00 by reducing his vacation time from 5 weeks to 2 weeks per year. This amounts to a total benefit of \$10.7K a year. Cost savings is what the public has instructed the county to do.

Commissioner Genter stated that it is not saving the PERS system any dollars. Commissioner Short stating that it is not costing it more either. If someone else was hired, retired, there would be a payout there also. Commissioner Genter stated that in this case, a retire rehire, the total percentage will go into an annuity that will be drawn out when he retires. It does not go into the pot like a regular hire. This too will come as a cost to the taxpayers. It is by statute that these benefits be provided. These are not provided in the private sector.

Commissioner Short stated that this is a skilled

Mr. Onweller stated that he cannot speak to that as they did not have that discussion. **WHEREAS**, Frank Onweller, Fulton County Engineer, has informed the Board of Commissioners of the retirement of Mr. Jack E. Brooks, the current Tax Map Draftsperson, effective October 29, 2010; and

**WHEREAS**, ORC §5713.10 states that the county engineer shall appoint the necessary draftsmen and fix the salary thereof, subject to the approval of the Board of Commissioners; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to ORC §5713.10 and §145.381, the County Engineer is requesting approval by the Board of Commissioners to rehire Mr. Brooks to the position of Tax Map Draftsperson, effective November 1, 2010; and

**WHEREAS**, ORC §145.381(A) applies in the case of a person who is or most recently has been employed by a public employer in a position that is customarily filled by a vote of members of a board or commission or by the legislative authority of a county, municipal corporation, or township. (B) A board Commission, or legislative authority that proposes to continue the employment as a reemployed retirant or rehire as a reemployed retirant to the same position an individual described in division (A) of this section shall do both of the following in accordance with the rules adopted under division (C) of this section:

- (1) Not less than sixty days before the employment as a reemployed retirant is to begin, give public notice that the person is or will be retired and is seeking employment with the public employer;
- (2) Between fifteen and thirty days before the employment as a reemployed retirant is to begin and after complying with division (B)(1) of this section, hold a public meeting on the issue of the person being employed by the public employer. Notice regarding division (B)(1) of this section shall include the time, date, and location at which the public meeting is to take place.

(C) The Public Employees Retirement Board shall adopt rules as necessary to implement this action.
