FULTON COUNTY, OHIO

Fulton County, in the northwest part of the state, has a total land area of 260,500 acres, (407 square miles), and a population of 42,698 (2010 Census). The land forms a level to gently undulating plain with some rolling and ridge areas. It is nearly rectangular in shape, bounded on the north by Michigan, on the east by Lucas County, on the south by Henry County, with Williams County to the west. It has a moderate average temperature of 51.7°F and an average annual precipitation of 35.89 inches.

The county, named after Robert Fulton, the inventor of the steamboat, was organized on February 28, 1850, but permanent settlement did not begin until around 1870. These original hardy pioneers came primarily from eastern Ohio, Pennsylvania and New York states.

Fulton County has been and continues to be agriculture oriented, with nearly 78% of its land under cultivation or forested, and being ranked in the top seven counties in the state for agriculture.

The County has a wide variety of industrialization; including woodworking, steel, and automotive.

Fulton County has a wide variety of transportation access, including two major bisecting railroads, an airport located in the center of the county, and three exits along the Ohio Turnpike.

Wauseon, the county seat and largest community, has a population of 7,332 and is just south of the geographic center of the county. In addition to Wauseon, named for a famous Ottawa Indian chieftain who once ruled over a settlement here, there are six other incorporated villages in the county. Their combined population is 20,833, comprising 49% of the total county population.

Recreational facilities, in addition to area golf courses and private campgrounds, include three state parks, Harrison Lake and Gull Woods in the western part of the county, and Maumee State Forest located in the eastern sector. Harrison Lake, southwest of Fayette, utilizes 246 acres with a 105 acre lake. Excellent facilities for picnicking, swimming, boating, and camping are provided, including Camp Palmer.

The state maintains 140.63 miles of road in Fulton County and Ohio Turnpike Commission operates 26.10 miles. There are 363.35 miles of county roads and 383.81 miles under township jurisdiction.

The County Engineer, County Commissioners and Township Trustees of Fulton County are dedicated to improving and maintaining first class roads and drainage networks for the benefit of county residents and our welcome visitors.

Survey History of Fulton County Ohio

Fulton County comprises two original General Land Office (GLO) surveys. These include the surveys North and East of the First Principal Meridian and Baseline and part of the Michigan Meridian and Baseline. The First Principal Meridian is the Western boundary of the State of Ohio and originates at the Greenville Treaty Line, then heads north. The Michigan Meridian starts at Fort Defiance on the Maumee River in Ohio, and is projected due North, controlling Ranges East and West. The Michigan Baseline is just North of Detroit and controls the Townships heading south into Northwestern Ohio.

The State Line between Ohio and Michigan was first surveyed by William Harris in 1817, but disputed by Michigan, therefore being surveyed again by John Fulton in 1818. Due to the vague description within the original Northwest Ordinance of 1787, the difference in the two surveys was approximately 400 square miles. To compromise, the State of Ohio was granted the 400 square miles of disputed territory, and Michigan was given approximately 9000 square miles of what is today the Upper Peninsula.

The GLO surveys, across Fulton County, were performed between 1815 and 1821 by Deputy Surveyors like Joseph Wampler. Since Ohio was the testing grounds for the Public Land Survey System across the United States, Northwestern Ohio is an example of the end result. In *Ohio Land Subdivisions* by C.E. Sherman, he wrote "The survey of this region was the last of the Government's experiments with systems of division in Ohio, and the general plan of survey there adopted has since been used over the vast expanse of our public domain west to the Pacific Ocean".
