Did you Know?

Fulton County has only one lake, Harrison Lake, in Fayette.

In 1836, the United States Congress and the Ohio Legislature settled a 10-year dispute with Michigan over state boundary lines, making Harrison Lake part of Ohio. In 1941, a dam over Mill Creek was completed and a 105 acre lake was formed (the area was once a swampy wetland).

The land was only known for hunting and fishing until 1950 when Harrison Lake was established as a state park. Today, it has multiple recreational usages, which some are swimming, camping and cabin lodging. (Photo Credit: Jeremy Williams, Williams Aerial.)
