A Message from Commissioner Jon Rupp

Dear Fulton County Residents,

2019 has been a busy year for Fulton County. As we move forward into 2020, the past year has put us into a position for a strong and great year.

Allow me a chance to list a few items quickly that continue annually to have an impact on our County. Our unemployment rate continues to remain low at 3.9% as of the end of December. With the announcement of the North Star BlueScope's approximate \$700 million expansion and the possibility of additional industries moving into the area, the County's projected unemployment outlook should remain low for coming years. Our ability to fill those positions and provide housing for those jobs will remain a priority. Based on businesses staying or moving into Fulton County, it has allowed sales tax and other revenue streams to remain strong.

We had our share of calamities this year too. The wet spring kept farmers from planting their crops and the wet weather continued through fall making 2019 a stressful year for our number one industry, farmers and rural communities. We also had a fire at MetalX in Delta. This fire involved our 9 fire departments plus more from the surrounding counties. However, this allowed us to activate Fulton County's Emergency Management Agency. The professionalism and teamwork by everyone during this event is something residents of Fulton County can be proud of.

We also had a couple of great projects in the County. With the release of the Fixed Based Operator (FBO) at Fulton County Airport the Airport Authority and the County Commissioners worked together and decided on a new future direction for the airport. The decision between the two groups is that the airport operations will continue to be managed by the Airport Authority with maintenance of the facility managed by the Board of Commissioners. Fulton County Economic Development offices moved out to the airport as well. This has created new activity and excitement around the airport. Another project, which took most of the year, was the historic renovation at the Courthouse. This was a great example of cooperation between our elected officials and their offices. Moving offices around temporarily and changing the flow of daily business proved challenging at times but everyone effected was able to overcome those challenges and continue on. In the end, having the Courthouse updated with new HVAC, sprinkler system, handicap accessibility and technology preserves the viability of the building for many, many years to come. The total project expense was over \$4 million but it was with money already in-hand. Nothing was loaned, bonded or levied. This paid for the restoration and preservation and is one more reason why Fulton County residents should be proud.

Overall, 2019 was a good year. I, as well as the other Commissioners, look forward to serving you in 2020!



Economic Development

North Star BlueScope Steel Begins Expansion

Late 2019, North Star BlueScope Steel started expansion of their mini-steel mill facility in York Township. Phase 1 is construction of an administrative office building and warehouse. As well as the demolition of their current office building. Phase 2, in 2020, square footage will be added to accommodate a new furnace and caster. The layout of the industrial plant will include space for more rail cars, on-site truck traffic and more employees. This is the largest one-time investment expansion, nearly \$700 million and 90 new employees, ever made by a business in Fulton County and is one of the top five largest projects in Ohio for 2019.

American Power Pull Relocates

Summer 2019, American Power Pull relocated from Wauseon to a larger space in Archbold. Relocation effort was supported by a loan from the Village of Archbold to VMT Holdings, the company that leases the space to American Power Pull. VMT Holdings spent about eight months renovating. American Power Pull was the first company that located operations in the space and other businesses have been inquiring about the building.

Haas Door Adds Additional Square Feet in Wauseon

Haas Door Company, Wauseon, invested in a new building for warehousing and light assembly. The building was finished in the fall of 2019. Haas Door has moved a portion of their overall operation into the space. This additional space allows for continued growth.

Wauseon Welcomes Cleanlites Recycling

Late 2018, Cleanlites Recycling, a business from Mason, Michigan, acquired an industrial building on Linfoot Street, Wauseon. After extensive renovations, the company started operations in late 2019. This company specializes in recycling air bags and may include other forms of recycling over time. The company worked with the FCEDC and the Northwest Ohio Solid Waste District to obtain a grant from the Ohio EPA to purchase unique equipment that they need in their operations.






Senior Center







Highlights 2019

Fulton County Courthouse Renovation

In 1851, the first Fulton County Courthouse was built in Ottokee, which was near the geographical center of the county. This courthouse burned in a fire in 1864 forcing the county to plan a second courthouse. The second courthouse served for several years until 1869 when a railroad company surveyed and chose Wauseon as their right-of-way. Voters then chose Wauseon as their new county seat, moving the location of the courthouse.

The new Wauseon courthouse was completed in 1872 at a cost of \$45,722.27. This is the courthouse we currently use today. A renovation and administrative addition was added in 1900.

Throughout the years, Fulton County Commissioners have been committed to the maintenance of the building. The courthouse is owned by the county residents, used by the county residents and is maintained for the county residents.

In the fall of 2018, historic renovations began and lasted approximately one year. Updates included a new cooling and heating systems, added security and technology features, an ADA elevator, restorations to 1900 façade in the Common Pleas Courtroom, sprinkler system and so much more.


