There will be a **\$10.00 non-refundable charge for the proposal**. Proposals may be shipped to a bidder. The bidder will have to cover shipping charges by supplying a shipping account number. Checks shall be made payable to the Office of the Fulton County Engineer.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 153.54, each bidder shall be required to file with his bid one of the following options:

1. A bond in accordance with division (B) of Section 153.54 of the Revised Code, providing for the Bid Guaranty and the Contract Bond in the full amount of the bid, or,
2. A Certified Check, Cashier's Check, or Letter of Credit pursuant to Chapter 1305 of the Revised Code, in accordance with division (C) of Section 153.54. The amount of the Certified Check, Cashier's Check or Letter of Credit shall be equal to ten percent (10%) of the bid. INSTRUCTION TO BIDDERS

- I. All Proposals must be in a sealed envelope and marked on the outside as "**2014 Reclamation of Dover Township Road 17 Project**" along with the name and address of the bidder.

Bids will be accepted at the office of Frank T. Onweller, P.E., P.S., Fulton County Engineer, 9120 County Road 14, Wauseon, Ohio, until **10:00 A.M., Thursday, August 14, 2014** at which time they will be publicly opened and read aloud.

- II. The bidder is required to fill in all the blank spaces in ink.
- III. The total bid amount for each individual bid item will be determined by multiplying the approximate unit quantities shown in the bid schedule by the unit price specified by the bidder. The lowest bidder will be determined by summing up the total bid amounts for the individual bid items in the bid schedule. The successful bidder agrees to accept the unit prices specified for each bid item as full compensation for the actual work performed.
- IV. The contracting authority reserves the right to waive any irregularities in the bidding procedure that are not in conflict with the Ohio Revised Code, and the right to reject any and all bids.
- V. Prior to entering into a contract, the successful bidder must submit a Certificate of Insurance, indicating that he has in force a minimum of \$1,000,000.00 in liability insurance and a proof of coverage by Workman's Compensation Insurance. If the project is a bridge project, said Certificate of Insurance must indicate a minimum of \$3,000,000.00 in liability insurance is in force.
- VI. All bidders must be willing to enter into a contract in which they agree and assent, as part of the general terms and conditions of that contract, to the statutory requirements contained in Sections 125.111 and/or 153.59 of the Ohio Revised Code, which requires the following:

Every contract for or on behalf of the state or any of its political subdivisions for the purchase of materials, equipment, supplies, contract for insurance, or services shall contain provisions similar to those required by Section 153.59 of the Ohio Revised Code in the case of construction contracts by which the bidder agrees to both of the following:

That in the hiring of employees for the performance of work under the contract or any subcontract no bidder or subcontractor shall, by reason of race, religion, color, sex, handicap, national origin, ancestry, or military status, discriminate against any citizen of this state in the employment of a person qualified and available to perform the work to which the contract relates.

That no bidder, subcontractor, or any person acting on behalf of any bidder or subcontractor shall, in any manner, discriminate against, intimidate, or retaliate

against any employee hired for the performance of work under the contract on account of race, color, religion, sex, age, handicap, national origin, ancestry, or military status.

For all contracts that are subject to the requirements contained in Section 125.111 of the Ohio Revised Code, that all bidders shall have a written affirmative action program for the employment and effective utilization of economically disadvantaged persons, as defined in Section 122.71 of the Ohio Revised Code. Annually, each such bidder shall file a description of the affirmative action program and a progress report on its implementation with the Ohio Civil Rights Commission and the Minority Business Development Office established under Section 122.92 of the Ohio Revised Code.

- VIII. **Whether the bidder obtained the bid proposal from the internet or received a copy from the Engineer's office, the bid documents shall be submitted bound and in its entirety.**
- IX. The bidder shall complete the enclosed list of subcontractors form. If at the time of the bid the subcontractors are undetermined, then the list of subcontractors must be submitted before the preconstruction meeting.
- X. Partial payments shall be made in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code. The Contractor shall submit a schedule of the work completed to the Engineer for approval. Payments shall be at the rate of 92% of the acceptable work completed until the project is 50% completed. After the project is 50% complete payments shall be made at the rate of 100% of the amount of acceptable work completed.

- XII. Liquidated damages will be deducted for work not completed by the completion date as per the Ohio Department of Transportation Standard Specifications.
- XIII. Work not completed by the completion date shall be subject to the deduction of county inspection, supervision and other similar engineering costs incurred after the completion deadline as per Section 5555.67 of the Ohio Revised Code.

- (e) ODOT CMS Section 108.01, The Prime Contractor must perform no less than thirty percent (30%) of the total original contract price in lieu of the fifty percent (50%) stated in Section 108.01.
- (f) A bidder may withdraw his bid from consideration in accordance with Ohio Revised Code Section 9.31.
- (g) The Contractor should replace the terms "the Department", "the Engineer", "the Director" and "the DCE" in the ODOT CMS with the term "agency awarding the contract." Furthermore, nothing in this document is intended to

alter the agency's adherence to the Ohio Revised Code, local ordinance or other applicable requirements which are properly established.

II. BID FILING

Bids shall be on the form prescribed by the contracting authority and filed in a sealed envelope at the time and place mentioned in the advertisement. The bids received shall be opened and tabulated at the time stated in this notice. Each bid shall contain the full name of each person or company submitting the bid.

III. BID GUARANTY

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 153.54, each bidder shall be required to file with his bid one of the following options:

1. A bond in accordance with division (B) of Section 153.54 of the Revised Code, providing for the Bid Guaranty and the Contract Bond in the full amount of the bid, or,
2. A Certified Check, Cashier's Check, or Letter of Credit pursuant to Chapter 1305 of the Revised Code, in accordance with division (C) of Section 153.54. The amount of the Certified Check, Cashier's Check or Letter of Credit shall be equal to ten percent (10%) of the bid. If this option is used, a Performance Bond issued by a surety company in the amount of 100% of the contract price shall be furnished by the successful bidder as a condition of the contract.

IV. QUALIFICATION OF BIDDER

Each bidder shall, if requested, furnish the owner satisfactory evidence of his competency to perform the proposed work. Such evidence of competency unless otherwise specified, shall consist of statements covering the bidder's past experience on similar work, a list of equipment that would be available for the work, and the list of key personnel that would be available. In addition, each bidder shall, if requested, furnish the owner satisfactory evidence of his financial responsibility. Such evidence of financial responsibility shall consist of a confidential statement or report of the bidder's financial resources and liabilities as of the last calendar year or the contractor's last fiscal year.

Such statements or reports shall be certified by a public accountant. Such statement shall also indicate whether the bidder's financial responsibility is approximately the same as stated; and if it has changed, the bidder shall qualify the statement or report to reflect his true financial condition at the time of submitting the proposal.

In lieu of the above-mentioned statement of financial responsibility, the bidder may submit evidence that he is pre-qualified with the Ohio Department of Transportation and is on the current bidder's list of the state.

V. AWARDING OF CONTRACTS

The award of the contract shall be made to the lowest and best bidder. The bond or check from all unsuccessful bidders shall be returned to them by the contracting authority

immediately upon awarding the contract or the rejection of all bids. The contracting authority may reject all bids. The Board of Dover Township Trustees reserve the right to alter any item of this proposal in order to meet budgetary restrictions.

Unless otherwise indicated in the specifications, the lowest and best bidder, after awarded the contract, shall enter into agreement within 60 days after the opening of the bids. Due to processing time, it is suggested that the successful bidder enter into written contract within 10 days of the notice of award.

VI. PREVAILING WAGE RATES

Prevailing wage rates ARE REQUIRED for this project and are attached.

VII. MAINTENANCE GUARANTEE BOND

The Contractor shall make all repairs due to defective workmanship or material for the term of one (1) year after the final acceptance date and shall correct and repair promptly during that time all defective work and material of whatever description. However, ordinary wear and tear or damage due to negligent or improper operation or maintenance on the part of the Owner shall not be considered any obligation to the Contractor. In case the Contractor shall neglect or fail to promptly make said repairs, after written notification, the Owner shall cause such repairs to be made at the expense of the Contractor and/or his surety.

As a guarantee for the faithful performance of the repairs for one (1) year as outlined above, the Contractor shall furnish to the Owner a maintenance bond executed by an acceptable surety company in an amount of one-hundred (100) percent of the final contract amount. Said maintenance bond shall be submitted with the final pay request.

FULTON COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE SUPPLEMENTAL SPECIFICATIONS

Except as modified by these plans and by the detailed specifications pertaining thereto, all work shall be governed by the Fulton County construction standards and by the State of Ohio Department of Transportation, "Construction and Material Specifications" dated January 1, 2013 and supplements, including but not limited to supplemental specifications, supplements and proposal notes, thereto in effect fourteen (14) calendar days prior to receiving bids.

DEFINITIONS: All references to **LABORATORY**, used in these supplemental specifications, shall mean a currently inspected **American Material Research Laboratory (AMRL)** testing laboratory capable of performing the mix designs in accordance with this supplemental specification.

ITEM 202 – PAVEMENT REMOVAL

Pertinent sections of **202 PAVEMENT REMOVAL** apply including or in addition to the following:

1. A milled butt joint shall be provided where new pavements meet existing pavements and bridge decks. These areas shall be established by the **ENGINEER** and provided in accordance with ODOT standard construction drawing BP 3.1. Milled materials may be used for placement along berm areas.
2. Residential driveway approaches that are either concrete or asphalt will also be required to have a milled or saw cut butt joint. Asphalt for these approaches has been included under the appropriate line item, along with an additional line item for the removal of the existing material.

ITEM 203 - ROADWAY EXCAVATION AND EMBANKMENT

This work shall consist of all excavation and embankment as directed by the **ENGINEER** in the attached set of roadway construction plans.

The **CONTRACTOR** shall be responsible for the disposal of any and all excessive and unsuitable excavated material.

ITEM 448 – ASPHALT CONCRETE

Pertinent sections of **401 FLEXIBLE PAVEMENTS** apply including or in addition to the following:

1. All pavers will be equipped with an automatic joint maker, which shall be used in making longitudinal joints. Longitudinal joints will be staggered between courses. The

longitudinal joint of the surface course shall be at the center of the specified pavement width. Material shall be placed to provide 1/4 inch/foot crown and to level longitudinal deficiencies with a forty-foot (40') automatically controlled leveling ski for pavements equal to and greater than 20 feet in width.

2. Asphalt will be bid and paid for on a cubic yard basis. All quantity in excess of the contract amount shall be at the **CONTRACTOR**'s expense unless otherwise authorized by the **ENGINEER**.
3. In the event of rain during laying operations, only those loaded trucks in route immediately after the rain has started will be permitted to unload, provided the surface to be paved was sufficiently tacked prior to the rain and that paving operations do not proceed through standing water.
4. No material will be laid on a wet surface or when the air temperature is less than 40 degrees.
5. Traffic will not be permitted on the asphalt until it has cured sufficiently that no marking shall appear.
6. All existing driveways and mailbox approaches will be immediately restored following daily paving operations. In the event that paving is interrupted over several days it will be the responsibility of the **CONTRACTOR** to attend to these areas on a daily basis, if necessary, allowing the residents safe use of their approaches.

JOB MIX FORMULA - ASPHALT CEMENT SUBMITTAL

The Job Mix Formula (JMF) for each asphalt concrete mixture specified herein shall be developed by the **CONTRACTOR** and submitted to the **ENGINEER** for approval prior to the start of production. In addition, the **CONTRACTOR** shall provide certified test results indicating that the asphalt cement to be used conforms to the attached specifications for asphalt cement. A separate JMF and certification of asphalt cement test results shall be submitted for each aggregate and/or asphalt cement source to be used in the project. During production of the mixture, the **CONTRACTOR** shall perform quality control procedures adequate to furnish assurance to the **ENGINEER** that the mixture delivered to the paving site is in reasonable conformance with specification requirements and can be incorporated in the work with satisfactory results.

One copy of the plant ticket shall accompany each load delivered to the paver and shall be presented to the **ENGINEER**. The total of the weights recorded on the plant tickets for each mixture furnished shall be converted to cubic yards for payment using the conversion factor established by the **CONTRACTOR** for each asphalt concrete mixture submitted to the **ENGINEER** for approval.

ITEM 407 - TACK COAT

Before placement of asphalt concrete, the **CONTRACTOR** shall apply a **TACK COAT** onto each intermediate course. Sufficient material has been provided in the estimate to cover the entire area of each paving course with **TACK COAT** at the rate of 0.08 gallons per square yard. The **ENGINEER** shall determine the final area requiring tack treatment together with the rate of application at the time of construction. Final payment quantity will be based upon the actual amount of bituminous material applied.

ITEM 614 - MAINTAINING TRAFFIC

1. Local driveway access shall be maintained at all times during construction. The **CONTRACTOR** shall provide residents and businesses with a minimum of twenty-four (24) hour notice when access to their drives will be restricted due to construction.
2. Lights, signs, barricades and drums shall be provided by the **CONTRACTOR** and placed in accordance with the latest edition of the Ohio Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices. Maintaining Traffic in accordance with the above provisions shall be included for payment in the lump sum for Item 614, Maintaining Traffic.
3. The **CONTRACTOR** shall install temporary centerline marking on the wearing course. In the event that the intermediate course and the wearing course are not going to be placed consecutively, the **CONTRACTOR** shall also place the temporary centerline marking on the intermediate course. Approved material for the temporary centerline shall be retroreflective pavement marking tape one (1) to one and one half (1.5) feet in length and at a maximum spacing of fifty (50) feet. Payment for the temporary centerline striping shall be included in the lump sum price for Item 614, Maintaining Traffic.
4. The **CONTRACTOR** is responsible for contacting and keeping informed, the Fulton County Sheriff and all affected school districts during the entire project.
5. The **CONTRACTOR** shall notify the **ENGINEER** in writing seven working days prior to the closing of Township Road 17.

ITEM 617 – RECONDITIONING OF SHOULDERS

1. Shoulder reconditioning shall begin as soon as the new pavement is able to allow berming equipment to operate without damaging the new surface.
2. Approved Material for this item shall be O.D.O.T. Item 411, limestone.
3. Lights, signs, and barricades shall be placed and maintained until berming has been completed. All shoulder reconditioning shall be completed before the road is

opened to traffic other than local traffic. Where any pavement course results in a drop-off of 2.0 inches or greater; reflective barrels, 18-inch reflective traffic cones, or reflective delineators shall be provided and maintained by the **CONTRACTOR** until such time as shoulder reconditioning operations have been satisfactorily completed. In the event that shoulder reconditioning is not caught up and/or drop-offs are left unprotected, paving operations will be halted until such time as shoulders are adequately reconditioned.

TESTING FOR QUALITY CONTROL

An independent testing laboratory may be retained to insure quality control on the entire project. Should any retesting be required to settle disputes, such testing will be at the **CONTRACTOR**'s expense.

UNDERGROUND UTILITIES

Prior to any construction activity, the **CONTRACTOR** shall contact the Ohio Utility Protection Service (OUPS) at 1-800-362-2764.

CONTROL POINTS

Before actual construction operations begin, the **ENGINEER** will reference all existing monuments, railroad spikes, iron bolts, etc. in the survey line. Upon completion of the pavement surfacing, the **ENGINEER** will reestablish all control points in the new pavement.

PROTECTION AND RESTORATION OF PROPERTY AND LANDSCAPE

The **CONTRACTOR** shall be responsible for the preservation of all public and private property, and shall protect carefully from disturbance or damage all land monuments and property markers until the **ENGINEER** has witnessed or otherwise referenced their location and shall not move them until directed.

LOAD RESTRICTIONS

The **CONTRACTOR** shall comply with all legal load restrictions in the hauling of materials on public roads beyond the limits of the work. The operation of equipment of such weight as to cause damage to structures or to any other type of construction will not be permitted. Hauling of materials over the base course or surface course under construction shall be limited as directed by the **ENGINEER**. The **CONTRACTOR** shall be responsible for all damage done by his hauling equipment and shall correct such damage at his own expense.

SUBMITTALS

Within 45 days from the date of the Notice to Proceed, the **CONTRACTOR** shall submit, to the **ENGINEER**, all required submittals, including but not limited to: material supplier(s), material specifications, shop drawing(s), sub-contractor(s) list, and project progress schedule. The **CONTRACTOR** will not be eligible for a contract time extension due to his failure to submit the required submittals in a timely manner. As a courtesy, the **ENGINEER** may provide each **CONTRACTOR** a list of required submittals for reference. The completeness of this list, however, is not guaranteed and it shall be the responsibility of the **CONTRACTOR** to verify its completeness.

The **CONTRACTOR** shall, in writing, inform the **ENGINEER** of all submittals that deviate from the requirements of the Contract Documents. Submittals that are part of a system shall be made as a fully integrated submittal that will enable the **ENGINEER** to verify compliance with the Contract Documents.

The submittal(s) shall clearly identify the project name and shall be complete with respect to dimensions, materials of construction, the name and address of the manufacturer and local supplier, and pertinent catalog numbers. The information shall include enough detail to permit the **ENGINEER** to verify compliance with the Contract Documents and the design intent.

The **CONTRACTOR** shall submit a minimum of two (2) copies of all submittals.

The **CONTRACTOR**'s stamp of certification and signature shall be required on all copies of every submittal made to the **ENGINEER**. The stamp of certification shall constitute a representation to the **ENGINEER** that the **CONTRACTOR** has determined and verified all quantities, dimensions, field construction criteria, materials, catalog numbers, and similar data, or assumes full responsibility of doing so, and that the **CONTRACTOR** has reviewed and coordinated each shop drawing and sample with the requirements of the Contract Documents.

The **ENGINEER** will review and act with reasonable promptness upon shop drawings and samples, but this review and action shall be only for the conformance with the design concept of the project and for compliance with the information given in the Contract Documents, and shall not extend to means, methods, sequences, techniques or procedures of construction, or to safety precautions or programs incident to such factors. The review of and action upon a separate item will not indicate acceptance of the assembly in which the item functions.

The approval of the **CONTRACTOR**'s submittals is for general conformance to the Contract Documents, but subject to the detailed requirements of the Contract Documents. Such review by the **ENGINEER** shall not relieve the **CONTRACTOR** of his responsibility for the accuracy, proper fit, functioning or performance of any phase of the work included in the Contract Documents.

If the **ENGINEER** rejects a submittal as non-compliant with the Contract Documents, or if insufficient information has been provided to determine compliance, the

CONTRACTOR shall make a re-submittal which complies with the Contract Documents or provides additional information as required. Re-submittals shall be clearly identified by the **CONTRACTOR** as such and all changes from the previous submittal shall be plainly evident through the use of conventional revision symbols, or an equally effective method.

COMPLETION DATE AND REMOVAL OF EQUIPMENT

All work shall be completed in its entirety by **October 31, 2014**.

RECLAMATION SPECIFICATIONS

ITEM SPECIAL – FULL DEPTH RECLAMATION

1. DESCRIPTION ~ Road 17 ~ Road H to Road J

This project is approximately 5,065 feet long. The existing asphalt pavement and stone base are approximately 21 feet wide.

No reclamation will be done on the turnpike overpass. From Road H to the north 600' is to undergo two passes of reclamation. North of the turnpike will undergo one pass of reclamation.

Reclamation on the 600' section north of Road H shall consist of pulverizing and mixing the existing bituminous surface along with the underlying granular base material at a depth of 6" (Pass #1). Once the above criteria are met, 304 aggregate shall be added at a 4" depth, and then the existing road material along with the aggregate shall be mixed at a depth of 12" (Pass #2). After the second pulverization pass, the reclaimed material shall be used to establish proper width, grade and a cross-slope of ¼ inch per foot. The material shall then be compacted to create an "In-Place" Stabilized Base Course (SBC).

Reclamation on the remainder of the mile, north of the turnpike, shall consist of pulverizing and mixing the existing bituminous surface along with the underlying granular base material at a depth of 9" (Pass #1). After this pulverization pass, the reclaimed material shall be used to establish proper width, grade and a cross-slope of ¼ inch per foot. The material shall then be compacted to create an "In-Place" Stabilized Base Course (SBC).

2. MATERIALS

- A. PULVERIZED BASE MATERIAL. The pulverized asphalt/base material in the roadway shall meet the following gradation requirements:

<u>SIEVE SIZE</u>	<u>% PASSING</u>
2"	100
#4	30-65
#200	0-10

- B. AGGREGATE. The aggregate to be added to the road shall conform to ODOT Item 304. The aggregate shall be purchased, delivered, and uniformly placed by the **CONTRACTOR** at the specified thickness.
- C. CEMENT. In the event that cement is required, Type 1 Portland cement shall be used and shall meet all state specifications. The cement shall be purchased, delivered, and uniformly placed by the **CONTRACTOR**.
- D. WATER. Water that is needed for dust control and/or to aid in compaction shall be clean and clear. If the water is of questionable quality, it shall be tested in accordance with the requirements of AASHTO T-26 and at the expense of the **CONTRACTOR**.

3. CONSTRUCTION

A. GENERAL. The **CONTRACTOR** shall provide all necessary labor, equipment, and materials, as required, to pulverize, mix, place and compact the SBC. All materials and provisions as specified herein shall apply.

B. EQUIPMENT.

- PRE-PULVERIZATION/SHAPING. The **CONTRACTOR** shall pre-pulverize all pavement materials within the roadway limits to the depth specified, shape said pulverized materials and compact pulverized material until no further densification is achieved. After acceptance by the **ENGINEER**, the **CONTRACTOR** shall commence with spreading and blending.
- The equipment for pulverizing and mixing the existing pavement surfaces shall be a self-propelled road reclaimer and have the following features and capabilities:

Reclaimer/Asphalt Emulsion Equipment

- Capable of pulverizing (In-Place) the existing pavement and base at a minimum width of 8' at a specified depth of 12" minimum.
- Cutting drum shall have the ability to operate at various speeds (RPM), independent of the machine's forward speed, with an adjustable mechanism to control chunk size and gradation.
- Shall have a breaker bar and/or mixture retention door on the cutting drum in order to help control mixture gradation and/or sizing.
- The cutting drum shall be fully maintained and in good condition at all times throughout the job.

The reclaimer model proposed for use shall have successfully been used by the **CONTRACTOR** or **SUBCONTRACTOR** on other projects and upon request, must be approved by the **ENGINEER**.

- AGGREGATE SPREADING. To insure accuracy and uniformity, aggregate shall be placed ahead of the pulverization process by means of a pull type paver box, pull type drop spreader, or self-propelled aggregate spreader. Gravity (tailgate) spreading of the aggregate is unacceptable, unless smoothed to a uniform and proper thickness.
- CEMENT SPREADING. The additive shall be placed with a cement distributor designed to spread a uniform coverage at the specified rate. The **CONTRACTOR** shall provide a method to check the application rate of the spreader and assure conformance with the contract or job mix requirements. Dry additives shall be spread in a manner to minimize dusting. Skirting shall be provided on the spreader discharge and extend to the SBC. The dry additive shall not be applied when wind conditions, in the opinion of the **ENGINEER**, are such that excessive blowing additive becomes objectionable to traffic or adjacent property owners.

- **RECLAIMED BASE COURSE PLACEMENT/GRADING.** Following mixing, the SBC shall be graded by means of a conventional motor grader or paving machine with automatic slope control, to the lines and grades established in the plans or proposal. Paving of this type is expected to be in accordance with acceptable base course products, with a tolerance of not more than 0.05' of irregularity. Reclaimed material shall be kept within the limits of the proposed base width. Any material spread beyond the proposed base width shall be cleaned up by the **CONTRACTOR**.
- **COMPACTION.** The number, weight and type of rollers shall be sufficient to obtain the required compaction while the SBC is in a workable condition. When reclaiming depths of 6" or more, breakdown rolling shall take place prior to motor grader manipulation utilizing a large single drum vibratory pad-foot compactor. Said roller shall be capable of applying 52,000 lbs. of centrifugal force minimum.

Intermediate compaction shall be performed with a 30-ton pneumatic roller equipped with a watering device or a single smooth drum vibratory compactor capable of a minimum of 52,000 lbs. centrifugal force. Rolling shall be performed until no displacement is detected.

Final rolling shall be done by a 10-15 ton single or double-drum vibratory steel wheel roller operating in static mode.

- **COMPACTION. (General)** Water, if required, shall be uniformly applied over the SBC materials during the compaction operation in the amount necessary to obtain proper densification. If during production rolling, the SBC material becomes unstable due to excess moisture, the material shall be aerated and allowed to dry to the point at which stability can be secured.

Rollers shall not be stopped and left sitting on uncompacted SBC. Rolling shall be established so that starting and stopping will be on previously compacted recycled material or on the existing bituminous roadway, if at all possible.

Any type of rolling which results in cracking, movement, or other types of distress shall be discontinued until such time as the problem can be resolved. Discontinuation and commencement of rolling operations shall be at the sole discretion of the **ENGINEER**.

C. **WEATHER LIMITATIONS.** Work shall be performed between April 1 and October 15, unless otherwise directed by the **ENGINEER**. The temperature shall be 50° F and rising, with no standing water on the existing surface. No work shall be performed if there is a forecast of ambient temperatures below 32° F within 24 hours. No work shall be performed if rain is predicted during the expected time period from the first reclamation pass to the final grading of the SBC.

D. **CONSTRUCTION LIMITATIONS.** When any of the operations, after the application of cement, are interrupted for more than 30 minutes or when the uncompacted

mixture is wetted by rain so that the optimum moisture content is exceeded by 2 percentage points, the decision to reconstruct the portion affected shall be made by the **ENGINEER**. In the event the uncompacted, rain-wetted mixture exceeds the specified moisture content tolerance, the **CONTRACTOR** shall reconstruct the portion affected at their expense.

E. **DRY BACK PERIOD.** Traffic may be allowed on the SBC before the new asphalt section is placed, however, it is at the discretion of the **ENGINEER**. Allow the reclaimed base course to cure/dry back for at least 2 days before placement of the new asphalt course. In the event of rain, the dry back period may be extended.

F. **SURFACE BROOMING.** The **CONTRACTOR** is to broom the SBC after the curing period and prior to placement of the asphalt overlay, to remove all loose stone. This stone may be used as berm stone, and left in place neatly along the shoulder.

Brooming of the road surface at any stage of the reclamation process shall be completed in a manner that all material is contained within the aggregate shoulder area. All material that is broomed off the surface and is outside the aggregate shoulder area shall be cleaned up by the **CONTRACTOR**.

G. **QUALITY CONTROL.** An independent testing laboratory may provide quality control monitoring and testing. Quality control may be provided during construction and/or after the reclaimed base has cured. All such monitoring and testing shall be at the expense of the Owner. The testing lab work shall include but not be limited to: the verification of proper cross slope and width of reclaimed base and verification that specified reclamation depths were achieved.

4. QUALIFICATION OF BIDDERS.

Upon request, bidders shall provide evidence of adequate experience with the materials and processes specified for this work for at least 2 years and shall submit the following:

A. **REFERENCES.** References may be requested from at least three public agencies where work of this class was undertaken by them in the past two years. These references shall list the following:

- Name of public agency
- Telephone & Fax # of contact
- Quantity of work performed in square yards
- Contact person
- Date of work performed
- Contract Amount

B. **EQUIPMENT LIST.** A list of equipment available for completion of this work shall be furnished upon request.

5. METHOD OF PAYMENT

Payment for all the above shall be included in the unit price bid for the respective items.

The expiration date of this wage schedule is listed above for your convenience only. This wage determination is not intended as a blanket determination to be used for all projects during this period without prior approval of this Department.

Section 4115.04, Ohio Revised Code provides, in part: "Such schedule of wages shall be attached to and made a part of the specifications for the work, and shall be printed on the bidding blanks where the work is done by contract..."

The contract between the letting authority and the successful bidder shall contain a statement requiring that mechanics and laborers be paid a prevailing rate of wage as required in Section 4115.06, Ohio Revised Code.

The contractor or subcontractor is required to file with the contracting public authority upon completion of the project and prior to final payment therefore an affidavit stating that he has fully complied with Chapter 4115 of the Ohio Revised Code.

The wage rates contained in this schedule are the "Prevailing Wages" as defined by Section 4115.03, Ohio Revised Code (the basic hourly rates plus certain fringe benefits). These rates and fringes shall be a minimum to be paid under a contract regulated by Chapter 4115 of the Ohio Revised Code by contractors and subcontractors. The prevailing wage rates contained in this schedule include the effective dates and wage rates currently on file. In cases where future effective dates are not included in this schedule, modifications to the wage schedule will be furnished to the Prevailing Wage Coordinator appointed by the public authority as soon as prevailing wage rates increases are received by this office.

"There shall be posted in a prominent and accessible place on the site of work a legible statement of the Schedule of Wage Rates specified in the contract to the various classifications of laborers, workmen, and mechanics employed, said statement to remain posted during the life of such contract." Section 4115.07, Ohio Revised Code.

Apprentices will be permitted to work only under a bona fide apprenticeship program if such program exists and if such program is registered with the Ohio Apprenticeship Council.

Section 4115.071 provides that no later than ten days before the first payment of wages is due to any employee of any contractor or subcontractor working on a contract regulated by Chapter 4115, Ohio Revised Code, the contracting public authority shall appoint one of his own employees to act as the prevailing wage coordinator for said contract. The duties of the prevailing wage coordinator are outlined in Section 4115.071 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4115.05 provides for an escalator in the prevailing wage rate. Each time a new rate is established, that rate is required to be paid on all ongoing public improvement projects.

A further requirement of Section 4115.05 of the Ohio Revised Code is: "On the occasion of the first pay date under a contract, the contractor shall furnish each employee not covered by a collective bargaining agreement or understanding between employers and bona fide organizations of Labor with individual written notification of the job classification to which the employee is assigned, the prevailing wage determined to be applicable to

that classification, separated into the hourly rate of pay and the fringe payments, and the identity of the prevailing wage Coordinator appointed by the public authority. The contractor or subcontractor shall furnish the same notification to each affected employee every time the job classification of the employee is changed.”

Work performed in connection with the installation of modular furniture may be subject to prevailing wage.

Where this condition is found to exist, the employer will furnish adequate protective equipment and a premium of five percent (5%) above the employee's regular rate of pay.

Cable Splicing:

When a workman is required to make up cables, pot heads, or splices, on lead cable only, a five percent (5%) per hour premium shall be added to the employee's regular rate of pay.
